


William S. Huey Wildlife Area





Location: The William S. Huey Wildlife Area is located on the Pecos River between Artesia and Carlsbad.

Total Acreage: 2,880 acres.

Purchase: William S. Huey Wildlife Area was dedicated in 1986 to mitigate habitat loss caused by Brantley Dam.

Description: The William S. Huey Wildlife Area covers land on both sides of the Pecos River in southern New Mexico. This area contains flat farm lend, grazing land and a river bosque.

What to See, Do, and Learn

Wildlife Viewing-Wildlife watchers may see deer and turkey, various songbirds, quail, and waterfowl year-round. Good binoculars are important. The best time to view wildlife is at dawn or dusk.

Photographing-The best time to photograph wildlife is at dawn or dusk. A telephoto lens may be important.

Hiking-Hiking is the best way to see wildlife year-round at the William S. Huey Wildlife Area or other wildlife management areas.

Bicycling-Restricted to designated, open roads only.

Horseback Riding-Restricted to designated, open roads only.

Camping-Not allowed.

Fishing-Allowed year-round.

Hunting-Small game hunting and limited draw deer, draw turkey, and draw pheasant hunts.

Closures-Activities allowed only in designated areas. See specific restrictions posted at the William S. Huev Wildlife Area.

Facilities-William S. Huey Wildlife Area does not have rest rooms, camp sites, or drinking water.

Fees-Hunters and anglers must have appropriate licenses and permits. Wildlife viewers, photographers, and hikers must have a valid license or permit. See the Department's website www.wildlife.state.nm.us for more information.

Motorized Vehicles-Not allowed beyond parking area.

Access Dates and Hours: (Open on Holidays):

Vehicle Access: - 1/2 Hour Before Sunrise to 1/2 Hour After Sunset: Daily

Walk-In: - 1/2 Hour Before Sunrise to 1/2 Hour After Sunset; Daily
