- c. Sketch how effluent water is released and where it is released (e.g. into a river).
- d. Sketch any recirculation of water, the volume, where it is gathered, when recirculation is used (i.e., continuously, seasonally, which seasons, etc.).
- e. Sketch water source, flow, and effluent through egg hatching/fry/fingerling buildings or units.

7. List all fish species and numbers of each reared on the facility during the past five (5) years.

10. List all sources of eggs and/or fish stocks introduced into your facility during the previous five (5) years. Include species, number, size (or eggs), suppliers' names, addresses, telephone numbers, and dates. Include disease certification reports from these sources (attach).
